

This artwork was a gift given by Suleiman Awath Bin Ageel al-Nahdi to his attorneys during a visit to Guantánamo on April 17, 2007. The artwork was initially deemed classified by the U.S. government. Mr. al-Nadhi is a Yemeni citizen who has been illegally detained in Guantánamo Bay since 2002. Upon learning that his artwork would be published, Mr. al-Nadhi was moved to tears.
