#### **About the Artist:**

Adiba Khan teaches math, English, and biology at C2 Education. She studied biochemistry and journalism at the University of Washington in Seattle. In the past, she has worked as a biomedical research scientist and journalist in the Seattle area and abroad. She reported on access to contraception and unintended pregnancies among young women in Kenya in 2014. There she discovered that the true face of adversity is not apparent in statistics and academic papers. Rather, it is found in the strength and vulnerability of individual people. Her experiences speaking to young, Kenyan girls and women about intimate and often frightening situations inspired the artwork for this issue.
