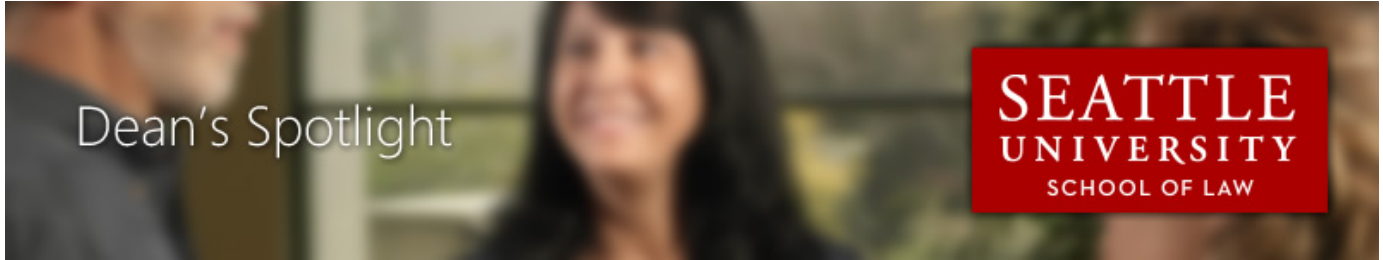

And he filed on Sept. 29, with co-counsel at ACLU-WA and Perkins Coie, a Motion for an Order to Show Cause Why City of Seattle Should Not Be Held in Contempt, in Black Lives Matter Seattle-King County et al. v. City of Seattle.
