The *Seattle University Law Review* regrets the following errors occurring in Jessie Allen, *Beyond Faith and Reasonable Doubts: Investigating Belief in the Rule of Law*, 24 SEATTLE U.L. REV. 691 (2001). We offer these corrections and apologize for any inconvenience.

1. On the cover page, title page, and page 691, the title should read: *Blind Faith and Reasonable Doubts: Investigating Belief in the Rule of Law*
2. On page 713, the second full paragraph should begin: But the blindfolded figure of Justice
3. On page 716, the last sentence of the first full paragraph should read: Both believers and skeptics see the law as a tool: the prior social world, or some part of it, generates needs or demands, and the responds—with justice or coercive control.
4. On page 718, the last sentence of the second full paragraph should read: Lacking formal rules on the order of proceeding, whether or not to hear live testimony, whether the adjudicating Senators should abstain from contact outside the trial with the parties, the Senate improvised.
